It transitions the area into a 'nature-positive' environment while restoring the historic architectural integrity of its Victorian streetscapes.

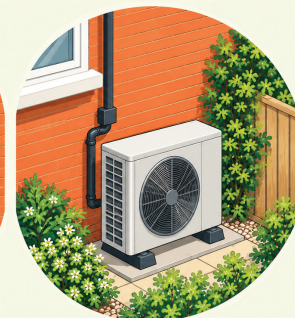


Reinstatement of Architectural Detail
